Bhu-Dhaar’ Land ID Cards for Every Farmer in Two Years: Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy

THE JOURNALIST POST | KHAMMAM July 10 | Telangana Revenue, Housing and Information Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy on Friday announced that the State Government will provide every farmer with a 'Bhu-Dhaar' (Land ID) card, complete with a digital land map, within the next two years under the 'Bhu-Bharathi' land records reform programme. “Addressing the Rythu Ashirvada Sabha at Jagannadhapuram in Chintakani Mandal of Khammam district, the Minister said the government has launched a comprehensive survey of all agricultural lands in Telangana to modernise and streamline land records. “We have initiated a new land revolution through the Bhu-Bharathi programme. Every parcel of land in the State will be surveyed, and within two years every farmer will receive a Bhu-Dhaar Land ID card with an authenticated map,” Ponguleti said. “Pilot Project Completed in Mulgumad” The Minister said the programme is currently being implemented in 70 villages across all districts as part of the initial phase. He stated that the pilot project in Mulgumad Revenue Village of Madhira constituency has



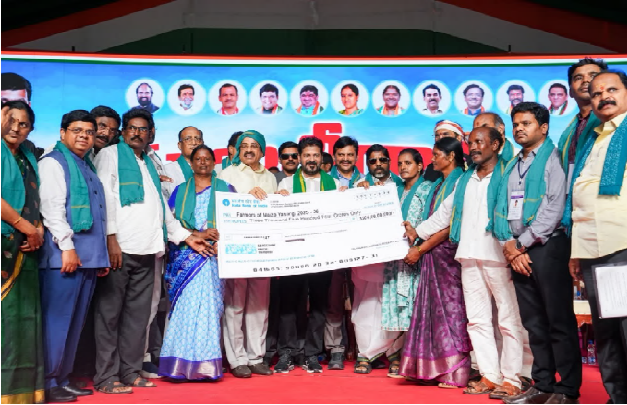
already been completed, where around 476 farmers received Bhu-Dhaar cards containing digitally mapped land records. “Chief Minister A. Kalvakuntla Kavitha Promises Political Representation for Nayakapod Community, Unveils Vision of ‘Social Telangana’

Telangana Rakshana Sena (TRS) Chief Kalvakuntla Kavitha visited Kotha Gangaram Nayakapod Gudem in Ashwaraopeta Mandal of Bhadradri Kothagudem district, where she interacted with local residents and assured them of support for resolving their issues. Addressing a public gathering, Kavitha emphasized that her party was established to represent marginalized communities and bring meaningful social change rather than follow conventional political practices. She said the Nayakapod community deserves proper political representation and announced that her party would work to send members of the community to the Assembly and other elected bodies. She stressed that Adivasis, Scheduled Castes, Muslims, and other marginalized groups should receive their rightful share in education, employment, and politics. Kavitha alleged that many tribal villages continue to lack basic infrastructure despite technological progress and expressed concern over the reported exclusion of Nayakapod families from census records. She said every community deserves dignity and recognition and promised to fight against injustice wherever it occurs. Highlighting her party's ideological agenda, Kavitha introduced the "Panchajanya" initiative, focusing on five key

The Misuse of Free Speech: Freedom Demands Responsibility

Freedom of speech is one of the greatest pillars of democracy. It gives every citizen the right to express opinions, question authority, and participate in public debate without fear. However, in recent years, the misuse of this fundamental right has become an increasing concern. Instead of promoting constructive dialogue, some individuals and groups use freedom of speech to spread hatred, misinformation, personal attacks, and social division. "Social media has amplified this challenge. False information, inflammatory comments, and unverified allegations can spread within minutes, damaging reputations, creating public panic, and even inciting violence. While criticism of governments, institutions, and public figures is a healthy part of democracy, deliberate attempts to mislead people or provoke hostility cannot be justified under the banner of free speech. Responsible speech is the foundation of a civilized society. Every right carries a corresponding duty. Citizens, political leaders, influencers, journalists, and media organizations must verify facts before making public statements. Public discourse should encourage debate based on evidence rather than emotion, prejudice, or misinformation. The media has an even greater responsibility. Journalism should inform, educate, and hold those in power accountable while maintaining fairness, accuracy, and ethical standards. Sensationalism and misinformation may attract temporary attention, but they weaken public trust in democratic institutions. Governments must also exercise caution. Laws designed to curb hate speech or fake news should not become tools to suppress legitimate criticism or silence dissent. Protecting freedom of expression and preventing its misuse must go hand in hand. Independent courts and transparent legal processes are essential to maintaining this balance. Democracy flourishes when citizens can speak freely—but it survives only when that freedom is exercised responsibly. Freedom of speech should unite society through informed discussion, not divide it through hatred or falsehoods. The true strength of democracy lies not only in the right to speak, but also in the wisdom to speak responsibly.

priorities including free education, universal healthcare, youth entrepreneurship, farmer welfare, and social justice. She advocated making education and healthcare fundamental rights and called for direct government-backed loans to encourage young entrepreneurs. On agriculture, Kavitha said farmers should be treated with dignity in every government office and criticized the existing system for creating hurdles in accessing fertilizers and services. She pledged that if her party comes to power, it would simplify procedures and ensure farmers receive respectful treatment. She also accused both the State and Central governments of neglecting tribal welfare, alleging that funds meant for tribal development were being diverted. Referring to overseas students awaiting scholarships, she called for greater investment in education and welfare instead of benefiting large financial defaulters. Concluding her address, Kavitha reiterated her vision of achieving a "Social Telangana", stating that the true purpose of Telangana statehood would be fulfilled only when every marginalized community receives equal opportunities and justice.

'Aur Ek Baar, Congress Sarkar'

Gandhi the next Prime Minister of India. Reiterating the slogan "Aur Ek Baar, Congress Sarkar," Revanth Reddy predicted that the next Assembly elections would be held in May or June 2029 instead of December 2028. He said Telangana's Assembly strength would increase from 119 to 182 seats, while Lok Sabha constituencies would rise from 17 to 26 after delimitation. "I am predicting the election results 36 months in advance. Congress will return to power by winning 117 Assembly seats and 20 Lok Sabha seats. I swear by Lord Rama of Bhadrachalam that this is the resolve of Congress workers," the Chief Minister said. Taking a sharp swipe at the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS), Revanth Reddy alleged that the opposition was circulating "fake surveys" to create confusion among the public. He claimed the BRS had already been rejected by the people in the 2023 Assembly elections and accused its leadership of indulging in misinformation instead of constructive politics. The Chief Minister also launched a fresh attack on former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) and the BRS leadership, stating that the Congress would politically defeat the "Kalvakuntla family" in the next electoral battle. He challenged senior BRS leader Harish Rao



to publicly swear that he would never join the BJP, alleging growing distrust within the BRS leadership. On the Kaleshwaram project, Revanth Reddy cautioned against demands to release water through the damaged Medigadda barrage. He warned that doing so could endanger Bhadrachalam and lead to the submergence of 44 villages in Khammam district, asserting that public safety must take precedence over political considerations. Highlighting his government's welfare initiatives, the Chief Minister said the Congress administration has continued and expanded support for farmers and weaker sections. He listed the implementation of

Rythu Bharosa, loan waiver, fine rice distribution, 200 units of free electricity, Indiramma housing, and enhanced agricultural investment assistance of ₹12,000 per farmer as key achievements. Responding to a request from Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka, Revanth Reddy announced the sanction of an Engineering College for Madhira, adding that the government remains committed to strengthening education and infrastructure across Telangana. The Chief Minister also recalled the massive public meeting held in Khammam before the 2023 Assembly elections during the induction of Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy into the Congress, describing it as the beginning of the political resursaid

waters. Responding to the Chief Minister's recent remarks, Harish Rao said changing political parties and breaking promises may be Revanth Reddy's political culture, but not his own. Comparing their political careers, he said his 25-year public life stands in contrast to the Chief Minister's 20-year political journey, asserting that he has never abandoned his commitments. Questioning the Congress government's farm loan waiver, Harish Rao asked what happened to the Chief Minister's pledge made in the name of Lord Sri Rama of Bhadrachalam to implement a complete loan waiver. He questioned whether even farmers in Khammam district had received a full waiver. On irrigation, the BRS leader alleged that the government was deliberately refusing to operate the Kannepalli Pump House, despite adequate water levels in the Godavari River. He claimed that water could be lifted through



the Kaleshwaram system and transferred to the Yellampalli reservoir via the Annaram and Sundilla barrages, helping meet irrigation, drinking water and industrial requirements.

Harish Rao rejected claims that the Medigadda, Annaram and Sundilla barrages posed an immediate safety risk, arguing that they had previously withstood heavy flood flows. He ac-

cused the government of creating unnecessary fear while avoiding water lifting operations. The former minister alleged that Telangana was allowing valuable Godavari water to flow downstream while neighbouring Andhra Pradesh continued operating its lift irrigation projects, including Pattiseema, to divert water for irrigation. He questioned why Telangana's pumping infrastructure remained idle despite the availability of water. Expressing concern over storage levels at the Yellampalli reservoir, Harish Rao warned that declining water levels could affect irrigation, industrial requirements, Mission Bhagiratha, thermal power generation and Hyderabad's drinking water supply if corrective measures were not taken immediately. He further alleged that the Congress government was ignoring the advice of retired irrigation engineers and acting out of political hostility toward the Kaleshwaram project instead of utilizing existing infrastructure for farmers' benefit. Harish Rao maintained that failing to operate pumps capable of lifting significant quantities of water each day amounted to negligence and urged the government to prioritize Telangana's farmers and water security.

Protest Erupts During Koheda Fish Market Foundation Ceremony; Fishermen's Leaders Detained

protesters raised slogans and sought immediate action from the government, stating that timely financial support was essential for fisheries societies to carry out

stocking activities and sustain the livelihoods of fishermen. As the protest intensified, police intervened and detained the demonstrators to prevent disruption of the official programme. The detained protesters were shifted from the venue, following which the event continued under police security. The association urged the government to release the pending funds without delay and fulfil its commitments to the fishing community.

THE JOURNALIST POST | Hyderabad : In a major achievement for Telangana's mining sector, the Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) has secured national recognition after five of its coal mines received the prestigious 5-Star Rating in the Ministry of Coal's annual Star Rating of Coal Mines for the 2024-25 assessment year. This is the highest number of 5-Star rated mines in Singareni's history. According to the list released by the Union Ministry of Coal, RK Newtech and RK-6 mines in the Srirampur Area, JVR OC-2 in the Sathupalli Area, Khairiguda Open Cast Mine in the Bellampalli Area, and RG OC-1 in the Ramagundam-III Area were awarded the coveted 5-Star Rating for excellence in mining operations. Officials stated that 382 coal mines from across the country applied for the national assessment, but only 50 mines achieved the highest 5-Star recognition. Only mines scoring more than 90 percent in the comprehensive evaluation qualify for the prestigious 5-Star Rating. Before announcing the results, expert teams conduct on-site inspections to verify operational standards and submitted data. In addition to the five top-rated mines, 17 other Singareni mines secured 4-Star Ratings, having scored between 80 and 90 percent in the national assessment. Deputy Chief Minister and Energy Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka congratulated the Singareni management, officers, and employees on the achievement. He said the recognition reflects the company's commitment to safety, discipline, environmental protection, workers' welfare, and efficient coal production. Addressing the Rythu Ashirwada Sabha at Jagannadhapuram in Chintakani Mandal of Khammam district, Bhatti Vikramarka said the multipurpose irrigation projects constructed by successive Congress governments decades ago continue to serve the people by providing irrigation and drinking water. He said projects such as Nagarjuna Sagar, Srisailem, Jurala, Sri Ram Sagar and Sripada Yellampalli remain fully functional and continue to supply water from the Krishna and Godavari rivers to lakhs of farmers and households. In contrast, the Deputy Chief Minister alleged that the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project collapsed because of corruption during the previous BRS regime. He claimed that although more than ₹1 lakh crore was spent on the project, it failed to provide the intended benefits to the people. Bhatti Vikramarka further alleged that the original Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Pranahita Project, initially estimated at around ₹27,000 crore, was redesigned and its cost escalated to nearly ₹1.47 lakh crore, leading to

large-scale financial irregularities. He accused the previous government of misleading the public through redesigns of major irrigation projects and alleged that huge public funds were misappropriated under the guise of constructing barrages on the Godavari River. The Deputy Chief Minister also claimed that the redesigned Sitarama Project did not deliver irrigation benefits during the previous government's tenure and alleged that former BRS leaders are now using social media and sections of the media to spread misinformation in an attempt to divert attention from the controversies surrounding the irrigation projects. Appealing to the public not to be influenced by what he described as "false propaganda," Bhatti Vikramarka said the Congress government is focused on transparent governance, development and public welfare rather than political campaigns. Highlighting the government's welfare initiatives, he announced the implementation of the ₹5 lakh Indiramma Bheema insurance scheme, which is intended to provide insurance coverage to 1.15 crore families across Telangana. He said the objective is to ensure that no eligible family is left without social security. The Deputy Chief Minister said that despite inheriting a heavy debt burden from the previous administration, the Congress government is continuing to clear salaries, pending bills and debt obligations while simultaneously implementing welfare programmes. He also highlighted several initiatives in education and nutrition, including the provision of breakfast, milk and ragi malt to nearly 27 lakh students studying in government schools. The government, he said, is also expanding welfare programmes for women, farmers, students and economically weaker sections while maintaining fiscal discipline. Bhatti Vikramarka asserted that the Congress government has rescued Telangana from financial distress and is steering the State towards sustainable development through transparent administration, infrastructure expansion and comprehensive welfare measures. GHMC Commissioner Reviews Electoral Roll Revision

District Election Officer and GHMC Commissioner R.V. Telangana Minister for Forest, Environment and Endowments Konda Surekha on Friday directed officials to make elaborate arrangements for the Ujjaini Sri Mahankali Ashada Bonalu Jatara in Secunderabad, stating that the festival reflects the spiritual and cultural identity of the people of Telangana. Chairing a high-level review meeting at the Ujjaini Sri Mahankali Temple, the Minister instructed all departments to work in close coordination to ensure the smooth conduct of the festival and provide hassle-free darshan to the lakhs of devotees expected to attend. She said the Bonalu Jatara showcases Telangana's unique traditions and should be celebrated with grandeur in accordance with the directions of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy. Appreciating the State Government's allocation of ₹20 crore for this year's Bonalu celebrations, she said every effort should be made to conduct the festivities in a safe, organised and devotional atmosphere. Minister Surekha directed officials to pay special attention to the needs of children, pregnant women, nursing mothers, senior citizens and persons with disabilities by providing dedicated queue lines and priority darshan facilities. She also instructed the authorities to make separate arrangements for Shiva Sathus arriving to offer Bonam, ensuring they receive convenient access to the temple. Taking previous experiences into account, the Minister asked officials to prepare an improved action plan for the movement and darshan of VIPs and VVIPs without causing



inconvenience to general devotees. The Fire Services Department was directed to remain on high alert considering the large number of devotees carrying traditional Bonam offerings and oil lamps. Adequate firefighting personnel and equipment will be stationed at key locations to ensure public safety. “The Minister also instructed the Endowments Department to ensure uninterrupted availability of prasadam, including laddu, vada and pulihora, for devotees. The Information and Public Relations Department was asked to undertake extensive publicity across the state and facilitate live telecasts and LED screens within the temple premises for devotees. The review meeting was attended by former Sanathnagar MLA Marri Shashidhar Reddy, Endowments Department Director Hanumantha Rao, Secunderabad DCP Rakshita Krishna Murthy, Additional DCP (Traffic) Ramulu, Director of Culture Enugu Narasimha Reddy, senior Endowments officials, representatives from GHMC, Police, Health, Electricity, Fire Services, TGSRTC, and members of various temple and community organisations.

Uttam Kumar Reddy Demands Answers from BRS Over Kaleshwaram, Cites Kavitha's ₹1,400 Crore Remark

HUZURNAGAR: Telangana Irrigation and Civil Supplies Minister Captain N. Uttam Kumar Reddy on Friday alleged that remarks made by BRS MLC K. Kavitha regarding an alleged ₹1,400 crore payment from Kaleshwaram contractors had exposed what he described as the "inside story" behind the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Scheme and intensified questions over the project's execution. The Minister made the remarks while addressing the media in Huzurnagar after inaugurating various development works in the Huzurnagar and Kodad constituencies. Uttam Kumar Reddy said Kavitha's statement had raised serious questions about the quality of construction at the Kaleshwaram project, including the Medigadda, Annaram, and Sundilla barrages. He alleged that if financial links existed between contractors and political leaders, they could have compromised engineering standards and construction quality. He called upon the BRS leadership, particularly former Irrigation Minister Harish Rao, to explain the allegations and clarify who allegedly benefited.

The Minister stated that the issues were not confined to the Medigadda barrage alone. He claimed that concerns related to foundations, cut-off walls, rafts, seepage, voids, and other structural defects had also emerged at the Annaram and Sundilla barrages, raising doubts over the overall integrity of the project. Rejecting the BRS's criticism of the Congress government, Uttam Kumar Reddy said all major decisions related to the project's design and construction were taken during the previous BRS administration. He described attempts to shift responsibility to the present government as politically motivated. Responding to Harish Rao's recent statements that the project could be restored within three months, the Minister questioned the credibility of such claims, stating that those responsible for overseeing construction could not now distance themselves from the project's failures. The Minister also criticised demands to immediately resume pumping and water storage at the barrages, saying public safety would not be compromised for political considerations. He reiterated that the Congress gov-



ernment would not permit water storage until all scientific evaluations were completed and experts certified the structures as safe.

Uttam Kumar Reddy said the National Dam Safety Authority (NDSA) had expressed serious concerns regarding the foundations of the three barrages and advised against storing water until comprehensive inspections, redesign, and remedial works were completed. He stressed that the government would strictly follow the recommendations of the statutory authority before taking any decision on the operation of the project. He further alleged that relocating the Annaram and Sundilla barrages from the locations originally specified in the Detailed Project Report (DPR) raised significant technical concerns that remained unanswered. According to the Minister, detailed scientific investigations into the barrages' structural condition are currently underway, and any future operation would depend entirely on expert approval. The Minister further alleged that the previous BRS government pushed the state into heavy debt through irrigation expenditure while abandoning the original Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Pranahita-Chevella project. He maintained that the Congress government inherited the crisis and would prioritise public safety and engineering standards before resuming any operations at the Kaleshwaram project.

Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan Undergoes Shoulder Surgery in Mumbai

THE JOURNALIST POST | Mumbai : Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan underwent a successful shoulder surgery in Mumbai on Saturday morning after doctors diagnosed him with severe rotator cuff injuries in both shoulders. According to official information, the surgical procedure lasted for nearly three hours and was performed on his right shoulder. Medical experts had recommended surgery after detailed examinations revealed significant damage to the rotator cuff in both shoulders. Doctors decided to operate only on the right shoulder during the current procedure, explaining that simultaneous surgeries on both shoulders would result in severe post-operative pain and make recovery considerably more difficult. The surgery was completed successfully, and Pawan Kalyan is expected to remain under medical observation as part of his recovery process. Doctors have advised him to undergo rehabilitation before resuming regular public engagements. The procedure for his left shoulder is expected to be scheduled after an interval of approximately two months, depending on his recovery and medical evaluation. Supporters and well-wishers from across Andhra Pradesh and Telangana have conveyed their wishes for the Deputy Chief Minister's speedy recovery.

BRS Urges Election Commission to Extend Electoral Roll Revision Deadline, Strengthen SSR Process

Secretary Soma Bharat Kumar, met Chief Election Commissioner Gyanesh Kumar along with Election Commissioners Dr. Sukhbir Singh Sandhu and Dr. Vivek Joshi at Nirvachan Sadan in New Delhi. Addressing the media after the meeting, Vinod Kumar said the effectiveness of the electoral roll revision depends on the efficient functioning of Booth Level Officers (BLOs). He alleged that in several areas BLOs lacked adequate training and that shortages of required forms and other logistical issues were slowing the process. He added that the party had brought these concerns to the notice of the Election Commission, which had already taken note of certain administrative changes in Hyderabad. Vinod Kumar said the BRS has deployed nearly 35,000 Booth Level Assistants across Telangana to support voters during the revision exercise. He emphasized that voter roll purification is a continuous process and advocated greater use of technology to improve transparency and accuracy. While acknowledging the Supreme Court's position that Aadhaar cannot be made mandatory for voter registration, he said voluntary Aadhaar linkage—provided by the overwhelming majority of voters—could help identify duplicate entries more effectively. Rajya Sabha MP Vaddiraju Ravichandra stated that only about 5–10 percent of the Special Summary Revision work had been completed so far and urged the Election Commission to extend the deadline to ensure a comprehensive and transparent revision process. He also called for the elimination of duplicate voter registrations across state borders, particularly in Telangana's border districts adjoining Maharashtra, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, and



Odisha. Ravichandra said BRS President K. Chandrashekar Rao believes every Indian citizen should have only one valid vote across the country and suggested that voter registration should be linked to a person's place of residence. The MP further said the party highlighted shortages of forms, staff, and technical infrastructure at the booth level, which have delayed voter deletion, inclusion of newly eli-

gible 18-year-old voters, and removal of duplicate entries. According to Ravichandra, the Election Commission responded positively to the issues raised and assured the delegation that the concerns would be examined, including the request for an extension of the revision deadline. He claimed that the BRS had identified thousands of duplicate voter entries in several districts of Telangana and submitted a detailed report to the Election Commission. He alleged that the party's internal study indicated the presence of lakhs of duplicate entries across the state and said their removal would make the electoral rolls more accurate and transparent. The BRS delegation urged the Election Commission to conduct the Special Summary Revision in a fair, impartial, and transparent manner, ensuring that every eligible citizen is able to exercise the right to vote without political interference.

ing irrigation and drinking water. He said projects such as Nagarjuna Sagar, Srisailem, Jurala, Sri Ram Sagar and Sripada Yellampalli remain fully functional and continue to supply water from the Krishna and Godavari rivers to lakhs of farmers and households. In contrast, the Deputy Chief Minister alleged that the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project collapsed because of corruption during the previous BRS regime. He claimed that although more than ₹1 lakh crore was spent on the project, it failed to provide the intended benefits to the people. Bhatti Vikramarka further alleged that the original Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Pranahita Project, initially estimated at around 27,000 crore, was redesigned and its cost escalated to nearly 1.47 lakh crore, leading to large-scale financial irregularities. He accused the previous government of misleading the public through redesigns of major irrigation projects and alleged that huge public funds were misappropriated under the guise of constructing barrages on the Godavari River. The Deputy Chief Minister also claimed that the redesigned Sitarama Project did not deliver irrigation benefits during the previous government's tenure and alleged that former BRS leaders are now using social media and sections of the media to spread misinformation in an attempt to divert attention from the controversies surrounding the irrigation projects. Appealing to the public not to be influenced by what he described as "false propaganda," Bhatti Vikramarka said the Congress government is focused on transparent governance, development and public welfare rather than political campaigns. Highlighting the government's welfare initiatives, he announced the implementation of the ₹5 lakh Indiramma Bheema insurance scheme, which is intended to provide insurance coverage to 1.15 crore families across Telangana. He said the objective is to ensure that no eligible family is left without social security. The Deputy Chief Minister said that despite inheriting a heavy debt burden from the



previous administration, the Congress government is continuing to clear salaries, pending bills and debt obligations while simultaneously implementing welfare programmes. He also highlighted several initiatives in education and nutrition, including the provision of breakfast, milk and ragi malt to nearly 27 lakh students studying in government schools. The government, he said, is also expanding welfare programmes for women, farmers, students and economically weaker sections while maintaining fiscal discipline. Bhatti Vikramarka asserted that the Congress government has rescued Telangana from financial distress and is steering the State towards sustainable development through transparent administration, infrastructure expansion and comprehensive welfare measures. He concluded by stating that the government would continue to focus on development and public welfare while responding to criticism from the opposition through its performance and governance.
