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CM Revanth Urges Telangana MPs to Push Pending Projects with Centre

Chief Minister calls for united efforts across party lines to secure approvals for irrigation, transport, education, and infrastructure projects.



HYDERABAD | The Journalist Post : Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Monday appealed to all Members of Parliament from Telangana, irrespective of political affiliation, to work collectively for the state's larger interests by securing pending approvals and funding from the Union Government. The appeal came during a meeting with MPs at Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Praja Bhavan, ahead of the upcoming Parliament session. During the meeting, the State Government made a detailed PowerPoint presentation outlining major projects awaiting Central approval, including irrigation schemes, transport infrastructure, education, urban development, and airport ex-

pansion. The Chief Minister urged MPs to actively pursue these issues with the Prime Minister and concerned Union Ministers. Revanth Reddy requested MPs to seek approval for establishing an Indian Institute of Management (IIM) in Hyderabad by taking up the matter with Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman. He also briefed them on discussions with the Centre regarding the takeover of Hyderabad Metro Phase-I and the expansion of Metro Phase-II, noting that the Centre had agreed to appoint SBI CAPS as a

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Quality Roads Essential for Industries and Jobs: Komatireddy

Rs 531 Crore HAM Road Projects Launched in Makthal; Four-Lane Highway to Cut Narayanpet Travel Time

MAKTHAL | The Journalist Post : "State Roads and Buildings Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy stated that quality road infrastructure plays a crucial role in attracting industries, strengthening businesses, and creating employment opportunities. He made these remarks while launching Hybrid Annuity Model (HAM) road development projects worth ₹531 crore in Makthal Assembly constituency of Narayanpet district on Monday. Along with Tourism and Excise Minister Jupally Krishna Rao and Animal Husbandry Minister Vakiti Srihari, Komatireddy laid the foundation stone for the Rs 237 crore four-lane Makthal-Narayanpet HAM road project. MLAs Yennam Srinivas Reddy and Veerlapalli Shankar, District Collector Priyanka, elected representatives, officials, Congress leaders, and party workers participated in the programme. Addressing the gathering, Komatireddy Venkat Reddy said the Makthal-Narayanpet four-lane road would be completed within 12 to 16 months, reducing travel time to Narayanpet to around 20 minutes. He urged people to cooperate with the road



expansion works and assured that fair compensation would be provided for land acquired for the project. The Minister appreciated Vakiti Srihari for consistently raising the demand for the road project and working towards securing approval. He said the government was focusing on both development and welfare programmes despite financial challenges inherited from the previous administration. Minister Vakiti Srihari said the Makthal-Narayanpet road was a long-standing aspiration of the people and was being realized under the leadership of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy. He added that the government was committed to accelerating development works in the constituency. Minister Jupally Krishna Rao highlighted that strong road connectivity is the foundation for economic growth and praised Komatireddy Venkat Reddy's efforts in securing major road development projects across Telangana. Freedom of Speech: The Lifeblood of Democracy — Rights, Responsibilities and Reasonable Limits

The sovereignty and integrity of India.
The security of the State.
Friendly relations with foreign nations.
Public order.
Decency and morality.
Contempt of court.
Defamation.
Incitement to an offence.

These constitutional safeguards are designed not to suppress legitimate criticism but to balance individual liberty with the broader interests of society and the nation.

Balancing Rights and Responsibilities

A mature democracy requires responsibility from both governments and citizens.

Governments must tolerate criticism, encourage open dialogue, and avoid suppressing peaceful dissent under the guise of maintaining law and order. Healthy criticism often leads to stronger institutions and more effective governance.

Citizens, on the other hand, must remember that every right carries corresponding responsibilities. Freedom of expression should never be used to spread hatred, violence, false information, or personal vendettas. Public debate should remain civil, factual, and focused on strengthening democratic institutions rather than weakening them.

The familiar principle remains relevant: one's freedom ends where another person's rights begin.

The Way Forward

Freedom of speech is a powerful instrument. Like any powerful instrument, its value depends on how responsibly it is used. Constructive criticism and dissent are not threats to democracy—they are among its greatest safeguards. Yet criticism must be rooted in truth, respect, and constitutional values.

Before speaking publicly or posting on social media, every citizen should ask three simple questions:

Is the information true?
Could it unfairly harm another person or community?
Does it contribute positively to society?

When citizens exercise their constitutional freedoms with responsibility, and governments respect legitimate criticism with maturity, democracy flourishes. India's constitutional promise of liberty is strengthened not merely by protecting the right to speak, but by encouraging speech that is truthful, responsible, and guided by the larger public interest.

Freedom of expression must always be defended—but with equal commitment to truth, dignity, and democratic responsibility.

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CM Revanth Urges Telangana MPs to Push Pending Projects with Centre



consultant. He urged BJP MPs Etela Rajender and Konda Vishweshwar Reddy to help expedite the metro expansion process. Highlighting infrastructure development, the Chief Minister informed MPs that nearly 95 percent of land acquisition for the northern section of the Regional Ring Road (RRR) has been completed, while Union Cabinet approval is awaited. He also sought support for initiating land acquisition for the southern section. On the Musi River rejuvenation project, the Chief Minister said the first phase had reached the tendering stage and requested MPs to persuade the Centre to include the project under the Urban Challenge Fund by obtaining the necessary approvals from Union Minister Manohar Lal Khattar.

The Chief Minister also discussed key irrigation issues, including Telangana's share of water from the Tungabhadra Project, desilting of canals, the proposed Godavari-Nagarjuna Sagar diversion, and the Godavari-Cauvery river interlinking project. He informed MPs that the Centre was facilitating discussions with Chhattisgarh, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, and Maharashtra on interstate water issues and requested MPs to actively support Telangana's interests. Revanth Reddy further highlighted that alignments for proposed bullet train corridors connecting Hyderabad with Bengaluru, Chennai, and Mumbai had been finalized. He said land acquisition for the proposed airports at Adilabad and Warangal had been completed and urged MPs to pursue proposals for Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul (MRO) facilities and air cargo ser-

Harish Rao Targets Congress Over Law & Order, Irrigation Issues

Harish Rao launched a sharp attack on the Congress government during a BRS workers' meeting, membership drive and SIR awareness programme held in Narayankhed, accusing the state administration of failing on law and order, agriculture and welfare commitments. Addressing party workers, Harish Rao alleged that the state's law and order situation had deteriorated and claimed that police were being used for political purposes instead of protecting the public. Re-

To strengthen coordination with Parliament members, the Chief Minister announced that IAS officer Advait Kumar Singh has been appointed at Telangana Bhavan in New Delhi to provide information and logistical support to MPs. He directed officials to extend full cooperation to all MPs, regardless of party affiliation, and asked MP Dr. Mallu Ravi to coordinate efforts among parliamentarians. Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka instructed officials to furnish MPs with updated information and status reports on all pending issues before Parliament sessions. During the interaction, MPs raised several concerns, including the revival of the Gadwal oil mill, paddy milling and storage capacity, protocol matters, and the need for expert studies on the Kaleshwaram and Palamuru-Rangareddy irrigation projects. He also predicted that Telangana would have more than 180 Assembly seats by the 2029 elections. Criticising the Bharat Rashttra Samithi (BRS), the Minister alleged that the party had lost public confidence after changing its name from TRS to BRS. The Minister further stated that the Roads and Buildings Department has launched road development projects worth Rs13,000 crore across Telangana under 34 different packages to strengthen the state's transport infrastructure.

As part of the public consultation process on the proposed Telangana Core Urban Region (Integrated Governance) (CURE) Act, 2026, Special Chief Secretary, Municipal Administration & Urban Development Sri Jayesh Ranjan, IAS, along with GHMC Commissioner Sri R.V. Karnan, IAS, held an interactive meeting with representatives of Resident Welfare Societies (RWS) in Hyderabad. During the meeting, Sri Jayesh Ranjan explained the key objectives and major provisions of the proposed CURE Act, which aims to establish an integrated approach to urban governance. BRS Seeks Extension of SIR Process, Raises Concerns Over Voter Verification

Party alleges shortcomings in voter enumeration, urges Election Commission to ensure transparency and protect eligible voters' names.



HYDERABAD | THE JOURNALIST POST: The Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) has sought an extension of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls, expressing concerns over the pace of the exercise and alleging irregularities in the voter verification process. Addressing a press conference at Telangana Bhavan on Monday, BRS SIR Coordination Committee member and MLC L. Ramana said party president K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) and working president K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) had directed party leaders to closely monitor the SIR process to ensure that no eligible voter is left out of the electoral rolls. He announced that the party has constituted a nine-member coordination committee to oversee the exercise across the state. Ramana claimed that voter mapping had not been carried out properly in several districts and said public concerns over the SIR process were increasing. He stated that only around 37 percent of the enumeration forms had been filled so far and urged the Election Commission to grant additional time for completing the exercise. He added that a BRS delegation had already met officials of the Election Commission of India and the State Chief Electoral Officer to submit its concerns. Former MLC Karne Prabhakar said the party had submitted several suggestions to the Election Commission and stressed that Booth Level Officers (BLOs) should conduct door-to-door visits with the assistance of Booth Level Agents (BLAs). He called for transparent implementation of the revision process, district-level reviews of complaints, and action against officials found negligent in carrying out SIR duties. Former Corporation Chairman Y. Satish Reddy alleged that the pace of the exercise was particularly slow in Hyderabad and claimed that many eligible voters could face the risk of deletion if the process was not strengthened. He urged the authorities to ensure that every eligible citizen's voting rights are protected. The BRS reiterated that the Election Commission should conduct the revision exercise in a transparent manner, address public concerns, and consider extending the deadline to facilitate wider voter participation.

Ranga Reddy Targets July 24 Deadline for SIR-2026 Completion

RANGA REDDY | THE JOURNALIST POST : Ranga Reddy District Collector and District Election Officer C. Narayana Reddy has directed officials to complete the Special Intensive Revision (SIR-2026) of the electoral rolls by July 24, emphasizing coordinated efforts to ensure every eligible voter is included in the electoral database. Following the weekly Praja Vani public grievance programme, the Collector chaired a review meeting with district officials to assess the progress of the voter enumeration process. He said the district administration has mobilized officials, field-level staff, local body personnel and special teams from various government departments to accelerate the distribution, collection, verification and digitization of enumeration forms. The Collector informed officials that special orientation programmes



have been conducted to familiarize staff with every stage of the revision process. Detailed guidelines have also been issued to ensure smooth coordination and timely execution of field activities. “Highlighting the importance of the exercise, he said a comprehensive action plan is being implemented to ensure enumeration forms reach every eligible voter. He appealed to residents to cooperate with election authorities by filling in the forms with complete details and submitting them to their respective Booth Level Officers (BLOs) before the July 24 deadline. “The district administration, he said, is committed to conducting the SIR-2026 exercise in a transparent and efficient manner while providing all necessary assistance to citizens. Officials have been instructed to ensure that no eligible voter is left out of the electoral roll and that the revision process is completed within the stipulated timeframe.

Bhatti Urges United Push for Telangana's Pending Projects

Deputy CM asks MPs across party lines to work together for IIM, Singareni coal blocks, irrigation clearances and central funds.

HYDERABAD | THE JOURNALIST POST : Telangana Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka has called upon Members of Parliament from all political parties to work collectively to secure the state's pending projects, funds and key approvals from the Union Government. Addressing a meeting of Telangana MPs chaired by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy at Mahatma Jyotirao Phule Praja Bhavan, Bhatti stressed that protecting Telangana's interests should remain above political differences. He also sought support for the allocation of the Sattupalli and Koyagudem-III coal blocks to Singareni Collieries, expansion of the railway network, irrigation project clearances, and attracting semiconductor investments to the state. Foundation laid for Makthal-Narayanpet four-lane highway; ministers say works will boost connectivity and regional development.

MAKTHAL | THE JOURNALIST POST : The Telangana Government on Monday launched major road infrastructure projects worth Rs531 crore in Makthal constituency, including the foundation stone for the Rs237-crore Makthal-Narayanpet four-lane highway under the Hybrid Annuity Model (HAM). The projects aim to improve regional connectivity and accelerate economic development in the area. “State Roads and Buildings Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy, Panchayat Raj Minister Jupally Krishna Rao, and Animal Husbandry, Dairy Development, Fisheries, Youth Services & Sports Minister Vakiti Srihari jointly inaugurated the works in the presence of public representatives, officials and local leaders.” “Addressing the gathering, Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy said the four-lane highway is expected to be completed within 12 to 16 months, reducing travel time between Makthal and



Narayanpet to around 20 minutes. He urged residents to cooperate with land acquisition for the project and assured that eligible landowners would receive compensation as per government norms. He said improved road infrastructure would encourage investment, industries, trade and employment. Minister Vakiti Srihari described the project as the fulfilment of a long-standing demand of the people of Makthal and said the government was committed to transforming the constituency through sustained investment in infrastructure. Minister Jupally Krishna Rao said quality road networks are essential for balanced regional development and praised efforts to strengthen connectivity across the state. The government stated that the new road projects form part of its broader infrastructure development programme aimed at improving transport facilities and supporting economic growth in Telangana.

Bhatti Blames BRS for Kaleshwaram Collapse, Announces Rs146 Crore for Devadula

Telangana Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka on Monday accused the previous BRS government of being responsible for the structural issues at the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project, alleging that key decisions were taken without following expert and engineering advice. He said the State Government would manage irrigation projects strictly in accordance with recommendations from technical agencies and experts. Bhatti Vikramarka, accompanied by Irrigation Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy and Revenue Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, inspected the J. Chokka Rao Devadula Lift Irrigation Project and reviewed water storage levels, Godavari inflows and the progress of ongoing works with senior irrigation officials. Addressing the media, the Deputy Chief Minister said reports from expert



bodies, including the National Dam Safety Authority (NDSA) and the Central Water Commission (CWC), would guide decisions on the operation and restoration of the Medigadda, Annaram and Sundilla barrages. He alleged that engineering recommendations were ignored during the previous administration, leading to structural problems, and accused the opposition of spreading misinformation on the issue. Bhatti announced the immediate release of Rs146 crore for priority works under the Devadula Project, including Rs58 crore for land acquisition, Rs74 crore for pending construction works and Rs14 crore for maintenance. He said the government aims to complete pending works on priority to ensure irrigation and drinking water supply across several districts. The Deputy Chief Minister said the government also plans to expedite the Devadula, Sitarama and Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Pranahita-Chevella projects as part of a broader strategy to improve the utilisation of Godavari waters and strengthen irrigation infrastructure across Telangana.

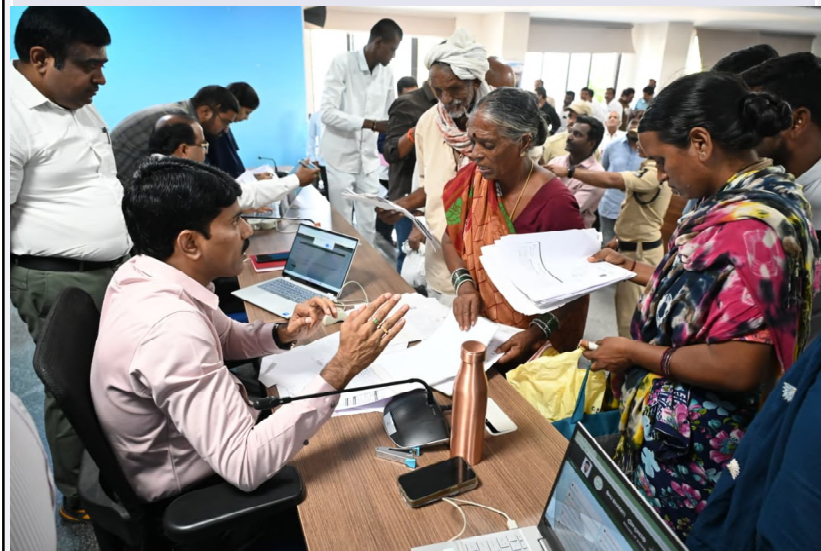

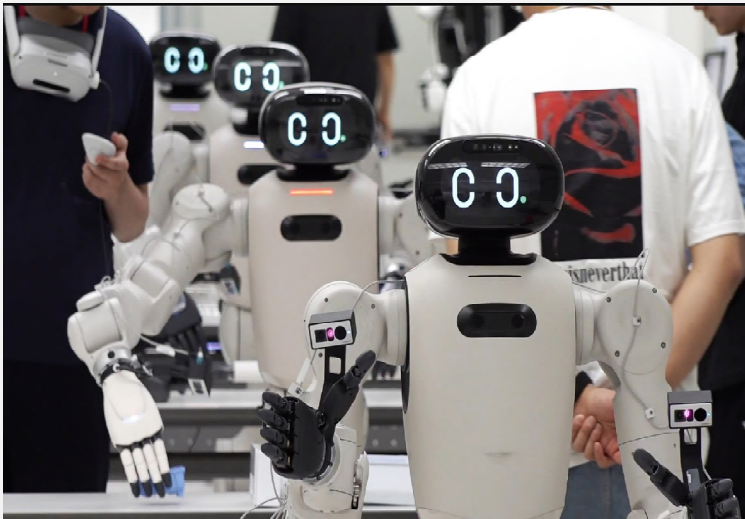
