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KTR Urges Centre to Approve Kazipet Railway Division, Boost Telangana's Tier-2 IT Growth



THE JOURNALIST POST | New Delhi | July 28, 2026 : BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) met Union Minister for Railways, Information Technology and Electronics Ashwini Vaishnaw in New Delhi on Tuesday and submitted detailed representations seeking the establishment of the Kazipet Railway Division, speedy execution of key railway projects, and enhanced Central Government support for Telangana's Tier-2 information technology ecosystem.

KTR Addressing the media after the meeting, KTR said the BRS places Telangana's development above politics and would continue to raise issues that benefit the state's people irrespective of political differences. KTR urged the Union Government to establish a Kazipet Railway Division as part of the restructuring of the South Central Railway.

He proposed that the division include the Kazipet-Ballarshah, Peddapalli-Nizamabad, Kazipet-Errupalem, Dornakal-Manuguru, Mothumarri-Vishnupuram, and Kazipet-Vangapalli railway sections, creating a network of nearly 2,000 track kilometres. He also requested the Centre to examine the feasibility of creating a Kothagudem Railway Division. Highlighting the 151-km Manoharabad-Siddipet-Sircilla-Vemulawada-Kothapalli Broad Gauge Railway Line, KTR appealed for the project's early completion. He recalled that the Manoharabad-Siddipet section had already been commissioned, but alleged that work on the remaining stretch had slowed.

Aajivika Mission (Rural) (VB-G-RAM-G) scheme.

The Chief Minister made the requests during a meeting with Union Minister for Rural Development and Agriculture Shivraj Singh Chouhan at Krishi Bhavan in New Delhi. During the meeting, Revanth Reddy briefed the Union Minister on the Telangana Government's Indiramma Housing Scheme, stating that providing housing for poor families has been a key priority of the state government. He said the previous government had failed to fully utilize the PMAY-G scheme, leaving lakhs of eligible rural families without permanent housing.

The Chief Minister informed the Union Minister that a survey conducted through the Awaas+ mobile application, developed by the Union Ministry of Rural Development, identified 11,56,915 eligible rural beneficiaries in Telangana. He requested that these houses be sanctioned to the state at the earliest. Citing the impact of El Niño conditions and deficient rainfall, Revanth Reddy also sought the inclusion of additional livelihood and agricultural activities under the VB-G-RAM-G scheme.

Cm proposed works such as vegetable trellis structures, fodder plots, mulberry cultivation, silkworm rearing sheds, kitchen gardens, bamboo plantations, water-

retention trenches on hill slopes, moisture-conservation works for plantations, and restoration of flood-affected agricultural lands.

The Chief Minister further pointed out that beneficiaries constructing Indiramma Houses are eligible for up to 90 days of employment under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS). He requested the Union Government to approve additional works under the scheme to generate employment and address local development needs.

The meeting also discussed incorporating state-proposed projects suited to Telangana's local requirements into the rural employment programme. Members of Parliament Dr. Mallu Ravi, Vem Narendra Reddy, Porika Balaram Naik, Chamala Kiran Kumar Reddy, Ramasahayam Raghuram Reddy, Suresh Shetkar, Gaddam Vamshi Krishna, and M. Anil Kumar Yadav, along with Chief Minister's Advisor Ramakrishna Rao and Secretary (Coordination) Advait Kumar Singh, were present during the meeting.

Hyderabad, July 28: Telangana BC Employees Association State President Mukurala Chandrashekhar Goud has called upon BC employees, students, youth, teachers, public representatives, and social organizations to participate in large numbers in the All-India OBC Mahasabha scheduled on August 7 and make it a grand success.

A poster related to the Mahasabha was unveiled on Tuesday at the Telangana BC Employees Association state office at Errum Manzil, Hyderabad. Addressing the media later, Chandrashekhar Goud said the programme would serve as a platform to safeguard the constitutional rights of Backward Classes and intensify the fight for social justice.

He demanded the immediate abolition of the 'creamy layer' rule for BC employees, stating that reservation benefits provided to BC communities under the Constitution were being gradually weak-

ened. He alleged that opportunities meant for BC candidates in government employment and higher education institutions, including medical, engineering, and IIT admissions, were being affected under the name of EWS reservations. He appealed to the BC community to unite and participate in the Mahasabha to protect political, social, educational, and employment rights.

High Court Verdict a Victory for Constitution: MLC Sravan Dasoju Targets Revanth Reddy Government Over HYDRAA

THE JOURNALIST POST | Hyderabad | July 28, 2026 : BRS MLC Dr. Sravan Dasoju on Monday launched a sharp attack on the Telangana government following the High Court's observations regarding HYDRAA and demanded that Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy take moral responsibility for the developments. Addressing a press conference at the BRS Central Office in Hyderabad, Sravan Dasoju described the High Court's order regarding HYDRAA Commissioner A.V. Ranganath as a major setback to what he called the government's "authoritarian style of functioning."

Sravan alleged that HYDRAA was being used as a tool for political pressure and claimed that the Chief Minister was responsible for the agency's decisions. "Ranganath is only an instrument; the person behind the decisions is Chief Minister Revanth Reddy," he alleged. The BRS leader demanded the immediate resignation of the Chief Minister on moral grounds, removal of the HYDRAA Com-

missioner, compensation to people affected by demolitions, and implementation of the High Court directions without approaching higher courts. Allegations of Selective Action Sravan Dasoju alleged that HYDRAA had targeted poor and middle-class families while ignoring alleged encroachments involving influential individuals. He claimed that demolitions were carried out without proper procedures and demanded accountability for officials involved in such actions. He alleged that the government should ensure equal application of law and questioned why action was not taken against structures belonging to politically influential persons.

Criticism Over Governance Style The BRS leader said the High Court's observations reflected concerns over governance and constitutional values. He alleged that the government had acted beyond democratic limits and claimed that the verdict strengthened the importance of the Constitution and rule of law. He recalled earlier warnings issued by BRS leaders KCR and KTR regarding HYDRAA and said the latest developments had validated their concerns. Demand for Compensa-

tion and Accountability Sravan Dasoju demanded that citizens who suffered losses due to demolitions should receive compensation from the government if violations were established. He also urged officials to follow constitutional procedures while implementing government decisions.

He warned bureaucrats against acting beyond legal boundaries and said that future governments would examine actions taken by officials if violations were found. BRS and Congress Continue Political Battle Over HYDRAA The controversy over HYDRAA has intensified the political confrontation between the ruling Congress and opposition BRS in Telangana. While the Congress government maintains that HYDRAA is necessary to protect lakes, government lands, and public spaces, the BRS has accused the agency of targeting citizens unfairly. The High Court's observations and the government's response are expected to remain a major political issue in Telangana.



Install 100-Foot Bronze Statue of Sardar Sarvai Papanna Goud: V. Srinivas Goud

Srinivas Goud demanded that a 100-foot bronze statue of Sardar Sarvai Papanna Goud be installed in Hyderabad to commemorate the birth anniversary of the historic leader. The demand was made during an event where leaders of the Jai Goud Udyama Committee invited former ministers Harish Rao and V. Srinivas Goud to participate in the 376th birth anniversary celebrations of Sardar Sarvai Papanna Goud, scheduled to be held on August 10 at Ravindra Bharathi, Hyderabad.

The leaders also unveiled the poster for the



celebrations. Speaking on the occasion, Srinivas Goud described Sardar Sarvai Papanna Goud as one of the first Bahujan rulers in Asia and said he played a significant role in governing the Golconda region along with several forts. He recalled that after the formation of Telangana state, the then BRS government under former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) issued a Government Order (GO) to officially conduct the birth and death anniversary celebrations of Sardar Sarvai Papanna Goud. Srinivas Goud stated that the previous government had allocated land at Tank Bund and sanctioned ₹3 crore for installing a statue of the historic figure to inspire future generations.

Demanding immediate action from the present government, he urged the Congress government to complete the installation of a 100-foot bronze statue by the time of the upcoming birth anniversary celebrations. CM Revanth Reddy Seeks Tough Action Against Question Paper Leaks, Defends HYDRAA

Says Rs 8,000 Crore Fee Reimbursement Arrears Were Inherited; Calls for National Policy on Exam Security

THE JOURNALIST POST NEWS DESK“NEW DELHI | JULY 28, 2026 : Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Tuesday called for stringent punishment against those involved in question paper leaks and urged the Union Government to formulate a comprehensive national policy to curb examination malpractices. Speaking to the media in New Delhi after meeting Union Rural Development and Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, the Chief Minister said unauthorized coaching centres had become hubs for question paper leaks and stressed the need for stricter regulation.

Revanth Reddy said the Telangana Government had restructured the Telangana Public Service Commission (TGPSC) on the lines of the UPSC to ensure greater transparency and credibility in recruitment examinations. He alleged that failure to act against the agency Globarena during the previous government enabled irregularities to spread even to CBSE examinations, affecting students.

The Chief Minister also criticized

what he described as increasing Central control over state universities, arguing that education should remain primarily under the jurisdiction of state governments. He said the issue deserved discussion in Parliament. On fee reimbursement, Revanth Reddy alleged that the previous BRS government left be-



hind Rs 8,000 crore in pending dues.

He said Vigilance and Enforcement authorities were investigating institutions accused of claiming reimbursements using fabricated data. He assured that genuine institutions would receive payments and announced that, going forward, fee reimbursement for each academic year would be released within the same year through a streamlined payment system. According to

the Chief Minister, Telangana requires approximately Rs 2,200 crore to Rs 2,400 crore annually to implement the scheme. Defending HYDRAA, the Chief Minister said the agency would continue its operations to protect lakes, ponds, storm-water drains, parks, and government lands from encroachments.

He stated that the government respected the judiciary and would examine the High Court's observations while continuing to safeguard public properties in accordance with the law. He also appealed to the media not to support those attempting to obstruct anti-encroachment

drives through misinformation. During the media interaction, Revanth Reddy also briefed reporters on his meeting with Union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan regarding Indiramma Housing and rural employment initiatives, stating that the Union Minister had responded positively and had been invited to visit Telangana to review the state's programmes.

KTR Slams HYDRA Operations, Says Government Must Respect High Court and Democracy

THE JOURNALIST POST | Hyderabad | July 28, 2026 : BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) launched a strong attack on Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy over the functioning of HYDRA, alleging that the agency has become a tool for political intimidation, selective action, and harassment instead of serving its intended purpose. Reacting to the Telangana High Court's observations on HYDRA, KTR urged the Chief Minister to respect judicial institutions and democratic values. "Respect the High Court. Respect democracy," KTR said, alleging that a government ignoring judicial concerns has no moral authority to speak about the rule of law.

Describing HYDRA as a "nine-headed monster", KTR alleged that the agency was being misused for blackmail, intimidation, and political vendetta. He stated that if the BRS returns to power, HYDRA would be abolished immediately, claiming that the organisation had deviated from its original objective. KTR alleged that HYDRA was selectively targeting ordinary citizens while ignoring alleged encroachments by influential individuals, politicians, and builders. He questioned why structures belonging to powerful people in lake beds and Full Tank Level (FTL) areas were not facing similar action.

The law should be equal for everyone. It cannot become a weapon against the poor and a shield for the powerful," KTR said. The BRS leader accused the Congress government of failing to provide houses while demolishing existing structures of citizens in the name of HYDRA. He further alleged that the agency had become an extortion mechanism and claimed that the earlier EVDM system was renamed and expanded under HYDRA.

KTR also alleged that the Chief Minister was ignoring repeated legal concerns and said continued defence of HYDRA reflected arrogance rather than accountability. He claimed that several government initiatives carried allegations of irregularities and demanded greater transparency. Allegations Against BJP-Congress Understanding KTR accused the BJP of indirectly supporting the Congress government in Telangana. He alleged that the BJP was not



taking strong action on issues involving the state government despite making corruption allegations. He claimed that the BJP-led Central Government had failed to act decisively on allegations involving certain Congress leaders and said the BRS would continue its fight against what he described as an anti-people government. KTR Defends BRS Financial Management Responding to criticism over Telangana's financial position, KTR said the previous BRS government had cleared pending liabilities inherited from earlier administrations while managing the challenges caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

He said government liabilities naturally move from one administration to another along with public assets. During the BRS rule, Telangana's monthly revenues increased significantly while major infrastructure projects were developed, he claimed. Youth Protests and Education Reforms Speaking about recent youth protests, KTR said the concerns were not limited to examination issues but reflected wider dissatisfaction over education and employment opportunities.

He warned that governments should seriously address youth aspirations instead of ignoring their concerns. He also called for accountability and transparency in examination systems. On proposed examination reform legislation, KTR said the government should first examine previous failures and ensure strong mechanisms to prevent paper leaks. He said BRS would support reforms introduced with genuine intentions. Calls for Fair Delimitation Policy On the issue of delimitation, KTR argued that states which successfully controlled population growth should not face disadvantages in future representation. He demanded a national-level discussion involving all political parties to protect the interests of southern states. KTR said the BRS would raise Telangana's concerns in Parliament and work to safeguard the state's interests.

Referring to the Telangana movement, Kishan Reddy alleged that during the first phase of the agitation for a separate state, 369 students lost their lives in police firing. He questioned whether those students were treated as terrorists by the Congress government at that time. He further stated that during the second phase of the Telangana movement, around 1,200 youths and students sacrificed their lives



due to what he described as Congress' delays and political decisions. He recalled the case of Yadi Reddy, who died in front of Parliament in Delhi while expressing his anguish over the Telangana issue.

Kishan Reddy also raised the issue of the Emergency period, alleging that thou-

sands of students, activists and democratic voices were arrested and harassed during Congress rule. He questioned whether the Congress leadership remembered the struggles of those who fought for democracy during that period. Congress remembers history only when it is out of power. When in power, its record includes arrests, restrictions on democratic voices and suppression of movements," Kishan Reddy alleged. He advised Priyanka Gandhi to study historical events before making statements on student protests and said that the experiences of past movements remain part of public memory. The remarks come amid a continuing political debate between the BJP and Congress over student issues, examination reforms, protests and the role of governments in handling public demonstrations.

despite submitting journalist identity cards, recommendation letters from public representatives, and official communications issued by the District Educational Officer (DEO), the school allegedly refused to extend the full concession.

Parents claim the principal informed them that the institution would provide only a 20 percent concession as per management instructions. Some parents have further alleged that students with pending fee balances were warned they could be denied attendance until the remaining fees were cleared, raising concerns over the emotional impact on children.

The controversy has triggered criticism from journalists' associations and parents' groups, who argue that concessions announced by the government should be implemented in both let-

ter and spirit. They contend that journalists play a vital role in society and that educational benefits extended to their families should not remain confined to official documents.

Concerns have also been raised over allegations that parents are being compelled to purchase school books and uniforms only through channels specified by the institution, including online platforms, resulting in additional financial burdens.

Educationists have observed that rising educational expenses—including tuition fees, books, uniforms, and other charges—are placing significant pressure on middle-class and economically weaker families. They have stressed that education should be treated as a public responsibility rather than a purely commercial activity. Parents' associations have called upon the Education Department to conduct a comprehensive inquiry into whether private educational institutions across Telangana are complying with government directives on fee concessions and other welfare provisions. They have also urged authorities to undertake

statewide inspections and take appropriate action against institutions found violating applicable regulations.

Civil society groups have appealed to Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, who also holds the Education portfolio, to intervene and ensure that government orders relating to educational benefits are implemented effectively. They maintain that the controversy should be examined through an official inquiry to determine the facts and whether similar issues exist in other institutions across the state.

The management of the concerned educational institution had not publicly responded to these allegations at the time of publication. The claims have not been independently verified, and any findings would be subject to an official inquiry by the competent authorities.

Nerella Incident: Kavitha Demands Justice and Rs 1 Crore Compensation for Victims



tims of the Nerella incident. She expressed regret for being part of the ruling family during that period and apologized to the affected families. Questioning the delay in justice, Kavitha asked why action had not been taken against the police personnel accused of excesses and the influential persons allegedly responsible for the incident even after nearly nine years. She demanded that the government provide Rs 1 crore compensation to each affected family.

Kavitha alleged that eight people were subjected to severe torture after protesting against a sand lorry accident and questioned whether human lives had become less valuable than sand. She demanded accountability from political leaders who had raised the issue earlier and sought clarity on the reports submitted by various commissions.

She criticized Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, BJP leaders, and BRS leaders for allegedly failing to provide justice to the victims despite raising the issue during political campaigns. She urged all parties to rise above politics and support the victims on humanitarian grounds. Kavitha said she would continue her fight until justice was delivered and assured the victims that her party would extend support in pursuing their legal and constitutional rights. She also visited Nerella victim Banayya and other affected families, listened to their grievances, and assured them of assistance.

nology ecosystem, innovation, advanced manufacturing, research and development, and avenues for strengthening cooperation between the Government of Telangana and private space enterprises.

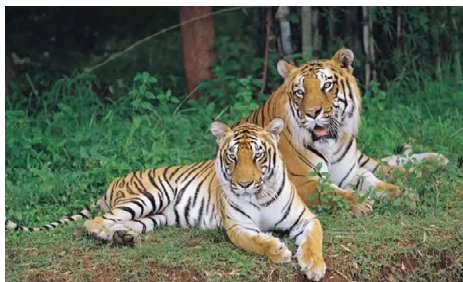

Telangana Re-Survey to End Land Disputes; Collectors Told to Ensure Time-Bound Completion

Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy Directs Officials to Intensify Public Awareness, Conduct Gram Sabhas, and Assign Unique 'Bhu-Aadhar' IDs

Hyderabad, July 28: Telangana Minister for Revenue, Housing, and Information & Public Relations, Sri Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, has directed officials to accord top priority to the state government's ambitious land re-survey programme and ensure its completion within the stipulated timeframe. He said the initiative is aimed at permanently resolving land disputes, establishing accurate boundaries for every land parcel, and assigning a unique 'Bhu-Aadhar' identification number to each survey number.

Chairing a high-level review meeting with Revenue and Survey Department officials at the Secretariat on Tuesday, the Minister reviewed the progress of the re-survey in selected villages, assessed public response, discussed challenges in implementation, and issued directions for the smooth execution of the programme.

The Minister informed that the re-survey is currently being carried out in 2,240 villages across

Telangana, with 70 villages from each district selected in the first phase. Stressing that public participation is essential for the programme's success,



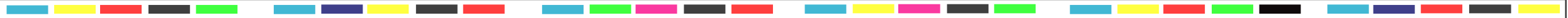
he instructed officials to conduct Gram Sabhas in every village to create awareness among farmers and landowners about the objectives and benefits of the re-survey. He directed officials to remain available in villages where survey work is underway, promptly address public concerns, and maintain complete transparency while determining land boundaries. He also emphasized involving local residents at every stage of the survey process to build public confidence.

Minister Ponguleti instructed District Collectors to personally supervise the re-survey operations and conduct weekly reviews to monitor progress. He stressed the need for close coordination between the Revenue and Survey Departments and directed officials to immediately bring any implementation issues to the government's notice for timely resolution. Highlighting the importance of land to farming families, the Minister said land is not merely an asset but the primary source of livelihood for millions of people.

He stated that the government has adopted advanced technologies such as DGPS, rover systems, and GIS mapping to ensure scientific and accurate demarcation of every land parcel, thereby eliminating disputes that have persisted for decades. "Upon completion of the survey, each survey number will be assigned a unique 'Bhu-Aadhar' identification number and integrated into the Bhu-Bharathi Portal, providing permanent clarity on land ownership.

The Minister said this would make land registration, mutation, and other revenue services more transparent, efficient, and citizen-friendly. He urged officials to treat the programme not merely as an administrative exercise but as a people-centric mission that directly impacts citizens' lives. Reiterating the government's commitment to building a land-dispute-free Telangana, he called upon officials to complete the re-survey in accordance with the targets set by the government. During the review, officials informed the Minister that survey work is progressing actively in 373 villages where land records and maps are unavailable.

The Minister directed officials to expedite the work, issue advance notices to pattadars (land title holders) before conducting field surveys, identify government lands, and finalize village settlement boundaries (Grama Kantham) before commencing the detailed survey. The Minister concluded by directing officials to ensure that the entire exercise is carried out in a transparent, people-friendly manner that minimizes inconvenience to citizens while strengthening public trust in the land administration system.

Eligibility Criteria Proposed
