TBRS Demands Extension of SIR Deadline,
Calls for 'One Person, One Vote' Nationwide

THE JOURNALIST POST“HYDERABAD | July 6, 2026 : Bharat Rashttra Samithi (BRS) Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) on Monday demanded an extension of the deadline for the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls, arguing that the current schedule ending on July 24 is insufficient to ensure comprehensive voter registration across Telangana. Addressing a review meeting with members of the party's special committee at Telangana Bhavan in Hyderabad, KTR urged the Election Commission of India (ECI) to strictly implement the principle of "One Person, One Vote" by ensuring that every eligible citizen is enrolled while eliminating duplicate and ineligible entries from the electoral rolls.

KTR alleged that Booth Level Officers (BLOs) appointed by the Election Commission had failed to create adequate public awareness about the SIR exercise in several areas. Citing field reports, he claimed that only 7 percent of the distributed SIR forms had been filled and submitted so far, raising concerns over the feasibility of completing the process before the July 24 deadline.

The deadline for the Special Intensive Revision process must be extended to ensure that no eligible voter is left out of the electoral rolls," KTR said. He also criticised the Election Commission for focusing on duplicate voter entries within individual districts while allegedly overlooking cases where the same individual is registered as a voter in multiple states. Stressing the need for greater electoral transparency, he called for the uniform implementation of the 'One Person, One Vote' principle across the country.

KTR said the BRS had already submitted a representation to the Chief Electoral Officer of



Telangana seeking an extension of the deadline and announced that a party delegation would soon visit New Delhi to meet Election Commission officials and press the demand. Highlighting the party's preparations, KTR said Booth Level Agents (BLAs) appointed by the BRS are actively monitoring the voter verification process throughout Telangana. He urged them to remain vigilant and ensure that every eligible citizen is enrolled while identifying and reporting ineligible entries.

He informed that awareness programmes for BLAs have already been completed in more than 93 Assembly constituencies, with similar meetings planned for the remaining constituencies in the coming days. During the meeting, KTR assigned district-wise responsibilities to members of the party's special committee to oversee the SIR exercise. Those entrusted with monitoring responsibilities include L. Ramana (Karimnagar), Dasoju Sravan Kumar (Nalgonda), Karne Prabhakar (Ranga Reddy), Soma Bharat Kumar (Khammam), Manne Krishank (Medak), Y. Satish Reddy (Warangal), Abhilash Rangineni (Mahabubnagar), Mujeeb (Adilabad), and Sumitranand (Nizamabad). Ravula Chandrashekhara Reddy also attended the review meeting held at Telangana Bhavan.

Priority for Housing the Poor Highlighting the government's flagship housing initiative, the Minister said nearly 32,000 families living in thatched houses across Telangana have been identified and will receive priority under the second, third, and fourth phases of the Indiramma Houses scheme.

He criticised the previous BRS government for concentrating housing projects

Progress Under Indiramma SchemePonguleti said approximately 1.30 lakh houses sanctioned during the first phase have already been completed and occupied, while another 70,000 to 75,000 houses have reached the slab stage. He reiterated that housing assistance is being provided to every eligible poor family irrespective of caste, religion, or political affiliation. Under the second phase launched by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, the government has sanctioned 2.5 lakh houses, targeting 2,000 houses in each Assembly constituency. The programme includes funding for 1,500 new houses and the completion of 500 unfinished houses in every constituency. The Minister said the government's objective is to ensure permanent housing for every deserving family while completing all pending housing projects across Telangana.

Issuing a stern warning against narcotics offenders, the DGP said drug traffickers would face uncompromising action. Our message is clear. Drug traffickers will be treated more severely than extremists and terrorists. From the Home Guard to the DGP, the entire police force stands united. Crime Review Meeting Held The DGP later chaired the District Crime Review Meeting at the Bhadradi Kothagudem District Police Office, where he reviewed law and order, crime investigations, and anti-narcotics operations. He observed that Bhadradi Kothagudem and Khammam districts, bordering Chhattisgarh and Andhra Pradesh, continue to serve as critical entry points for ganja trafficking and play a key role in the State's anti-drug enforcement strategy. The DGP directed officers to intensify operations against ganja cultivation and

transportation, strengthen surveillance at bus stations, railway stations, and border check posts, and increase the deployment of Dog Squads. He also announced the Telangana Police's objective of making the State drug-free by December 2029.

Emphasis on Speedy Investigations The DGP instructed officers to expedite criminal investigations, file charge sheets promptly, maintain complete documentation through the Crime and Criminal Tracking Network & Systems (CCTNS), and improve conviction rates by strengthening investigation and prosecution. Commending the district police for their work, he urged them to transform Bhadradi Kothagudem into a model district in effective policing and law enforcement. Inspection of TSP Battalion and SDRF Unit During his visit, the DGP also inspected the 6th Telangana Special Police (TSP) Battalion and the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) Unit at Palvanha, where he was accorded a ceremonial guard of honour. Government Must Intervene in Sirpur Paper Mill Issue: Telangana Rakshana Sena

Sena Sabitha Manohar Demands Action Against Management Over Alleged Harassment of Workers



Hyderabad | July 6 : Telangana Rakshana Sena State Leader and Sirpur-Kaghnaznagar in-charge Kaveti Sabitha Manohar has urged the Telangana Government to intervene immediately in the ongoing issues at the Sirpur Paper Mill, alleging that the management is harassing workers and that the government has remained indifferent despite prolonged protests.

Addressing the media at the Telangana Rakshana Sena party office in Banjara Hills, Sabitha Manohar expressed concern over the relay hunger strike being observed by workers, stating that the agitation had entered its 48th day without any meaningful response from the authorities. She alleged that the previous state government had extended a Rs 1,000 crore subsidy to the paper mill management on the condition that employment opportunities would be provided to local youth. However, she claimed that the management was recruiting employees from outside the region instead of giving priority to local residents, thereby denying employment opportunities to the local workforce.

Sabitha Manohar further alleged that the management had failed to conduct trade union elections and had instead constituted a committee allegedly favourable to the management, resulting in injustice to the workers. She criticised the state government for not responding to the workers' long-standing demands despite their continued protest. She demanded the immediate conduct of democratic union elections and called upon Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, Labour Minister Vivek Venkataswamy, and Industries Minister D. Sridhar Babu to intervene and resolve the issue at the earliest. Warning of intensified protests, Sabitha Manohar said the Telangana Rakshana Sena would launch a large-scale agitation in support of the workers if the government failed to take prompt action.

Congress-BRS War of Words Intensifies Over Kaleshwaram Project

THE JOURNALIST POST | Hyderabad | July 6, 2026 : A fresh political confrontation has erupted between the ruling Congress government and the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) over the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project, with both parties exchanging sharp accusations over irrigation management and the welfare of farmers.

BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) urged the Congress government to immediately resume operations at the Kannepalli Pump House and lift Godavari waters, contending that several districts in Telangana are facing drought-like conditions. He alleged that the government has failed to respond to the water requirements of farmers and has unnecessarily delayed the release of irrigation water despite the prevailing situation.



Responding to the allegations, the Congress government dismissed KTR's claims and accused the BRS of attempting to mislead farmers for political gain. It maintained that the Kaleshwaram project was burdened with structural deficiencies and engineering flaws during the previous BRS administration, and asserted that the government is proceeding cautiously while addressing technical and safety concerns before resuming operations.

The exchange has further intensified the political battle over the Kaleshwaram project, with both the Congress and the BRS holding each other responsible for the state's irrigation challenges. The issue is expected to remain a key point of political debate as concerns over water availability and agricultural needs continue to dominate public discourse in Telangana.

Coal India Reports Lower Q1 Production

July 6: State-owned Coal India Ltd. (CIL) reported a 7.5% decline in coal production during the first quarter of FY2026-27 compared with the same period last year. The company attributed the lower output to its demand-driven production strategy, which aims to align coal production with actual market demand while preventing excessive stock accumulation.



Coal India said it is focusing on improving supply-chain efficiency, optimizing inventory levels, and ensuring a steady supply of coal to power plants and industrial consumers. Despite the temporary decline in production, the company remains confident of meeting its annual output targets through improved operational planning and increased production during the remaining quarters of the financial year. Industry analysts believe the strategy could help enhance operational efficiency and reduce carrying costs while maintaining adequate coal availability across the country.

Kaleshwaram Row Dominates Telangana Politics as Congress and BRS Intensify War of Words

THE JOURNALIST POST | Hyderabad | July 6, 2026 : The Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project (KLIP) has once again become the focal point of Telangana's political discourse, triggering a fierce exchange of allegations between the ruling Congress government and the opposition Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS). The debate, which revolves around the utilisation of Godavari waters, irrigation management, the condition of project infrastructure, and concerns over drought in several districts, has emerged as one of the most significant political issues in the state. With rainfall remaining uneven across parts of Telangana and concerns growing among farmers regarding irrigation water availability, both parties have intensified their political campaigns, each accusing the other of failing to safeguard the interests of agriculture and rural communities.

The Congress government has firmly rejected these allegations, maintaining that the current administration is dealing responsibly with irrigation management while addressing several technical and legal challenges associated with the project. Government representatives have argued that engineering concerns identified in portions of the Kaleshwaram project require careful assessment before major operational decisions are taken. According to the ruling party, the government is committed to protecting public investments while ensuring that irrigation projects comply with technical, environmental, and safety standards. Officials have maintained that decisions re-

garding the operation and maintenance of the project are being taken based on expert advice rather than political considerations.

The Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project, one of the largest multi-stage lift irrigation projects in the country, was conceived to utilise the waters of the Godavari River for irrigation, drinking water supply, and industrial purposes across large parts of Telangana. Since its inauguration, the project has played a significant role in expanding irrigation facilities and supporting agricultural development in several districts.
